

Congressional Gerrymandering by the Numbers

Figures based on [Cook Political Report's 2012 Partisan Voting Index \(PVI\)](#).

STAT	FACT
23%	Truly competitive districts in 2012 (99 of 435 total districts are within 5 points of having neutral PVIs)
38%	Truly competitive districts in 1998 (164 of 435 total districts were within 5 points of having neutral PVIs)
77%	Districts where the Congressional election may be determined before voters wake up on Election Day (336 of 435 total districts have PVIs outside the 5-point margin)
52%	Districts with extremely lopsided partisan make-ups (226 of 435 total districts have double-digit PVIs)
100%	Extremely lopsided districts in Alabama (7 of 7 AL districts have double-digit PVIs)
71%	Extremely lopsided districts in Georgia (10 of 14 GA districts have double-digit PVIs)
89%	Extremely lopsided districts in Tennessee (8 of 9 TN districts have double-digit PVIs)
75%	Extremely lopsided districts in Texas (27 of 36 TX districts have double-digit PVIs)
0%	Extremely lopsided districts in Iowa, where districts are drawn by a nonpartisan commission similar to that proposed in the John Tanner Fairness and Independence in Redistricting Act (H.R. 223, Barrow) (0 of 4 IA districts has a double-digit PVI)
D+41	Most partisan Democratic district
R+29	Most partisan Republican district
